Flagship Publications

Sustainable Tourism for Development Report

The flagship report is aligned with the five key areas of the International Year of Sustainable Tourism for Development: (1) Inclusive and sustainable economic growth, (2) Social Inclusiveness, employment and poverty reduction, (3) Resource Efficiency, environmental protection and climate change, (4) Cultural values, diversity and heritage and (5) Mutual understanding, peace and security. Initially a **discussion paper**, it will turn into a full-fledged report after a global consultation with UN Member States, the private sector and academia. It will address the necessary changes for tourism to become a more effective tool for development and will include case studies from around the world.

Tourism and the Sustainable Development Goals: Journey to 2030

This publication will serve as a guidance document showing how the tourism sector can contribute towards the implementation and achievement of the 17 SDGs. In particular, it should encourage governments and tourism companies to incorporate relevant aspects of the SDGs into the policy and financing framework as well as business operations respectively. Both the report platform shall provide a roadmap for the tourism sector and the SDGs process until 2030.

Awareness-Raising Campaigns

“Travel. Enjoy. Respect.”

The Travel.Enjoy.Respect. Campaign focuses on increasing awareness among the public, in particularly travellers, on their active role in harnessing tourism’s contribution to sustainable development. The Campaign provides a better understanding of sustainable tourism while promoting the exchange of good practices and knowledge. It also engages all stakeholders in making tourism a catalyst for positive change, by offering tips on how to become more responsible travellers, based on the UNWTO Global Code of Ethics in Tourism.

Sleep for Peace Initiative

On the occasion of the International Day of Peace on 21 September, stakeholders in the accommodation sector are invited to join to carry out activities that raise awareness on the important contribution tourism can make to peace and peacebuilding. Guidelines for this purpose are developed. Join the existing “Sleep for Peace” initiative created by one of our Affiliate Members.
